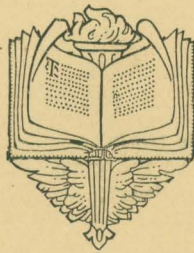

#### HISTORY OF THE PLAY

"Gammer Gurton's Needle" is probably the very first of the early English folk comedies, being written about 1566. Its actual authorship is not known, although it has generally been attributed to John Still, Bishop of Bath and Wells and formerly Master of Arts at Christ's College, Cambridge, where it was first produced. There is, however, no conclusive evidence of John Still's authorship; and the farce, "made by Mr. S., Master of Arts," as explained in the early prints, could easily have been made by William Stevenson or any other contemporary writer of the time. During the period when the play was written a steel needle was treasured as few family possessions are today, and when Gammer Gurton lost hers—the only one she possessed—the misfortune took on the importance of a genuine calamity.

The strolling players of the pre-Shakespearian times in spite of their restricted means had a charm of expression and made an appeal to the imagination by the very simplicity of the ensemble. The Portmanteau Theatre represents a return to the simplicity of the past, placing the emphasis on the play itself rather than on scenery and properties. The charm of this small theatre lies in its intimacy. The audience is not witnessing a spectacle which matches pennies with nature, but is treated to a phase of human nature transformed by the magic touch of the artiste's hand and the poet's imagination. The presentation is simple and direct, with only such aid from scenery as shall stimulate imagination to create its own illusions.
