Biographical Note

Dr. Charles Cashdollar is a Distinguished University Professor and Professor of History Emeritus at Indiana University of Pennsylvania (IUP). Born in Pittsburgh in 1943, he married Donna Evans Cashdollar in 1968. He earned his BS from Indiana University of Pennsylvania in 1965, MA from the University of Pennsylvania in 1966, and his PhD in History from the University of Pennsylvania in 1969. Dr. Cashdollar taught in the History Department at Indiana University of Pennsylvania (IUP) from 1969 to 2005. He taught courses about the history of American Thought and Culture, and the history of British and American Religion. In addition to serving as a Professor in the History Department, Dr. Cashdollar served as the first Director of Liberal Studies at IUP from 1987-1993. The author of many publications, including his most recent book *The IUP Story: From Normal School to University* (2021).
