JEFFERY LARKIN, KEYNOTE SPEAKER



Jeffery L. Larkin
Biology

Jeffery L. Larkin, professor of biology, is IUP's 2018-19 Distinguished University Professor. A member of the IUP faculty since 2005, he is also the recipient of the 2018 Distinguished Faculty Award for Research.

State, federal, and international agencies have praised Dr. Larkin for his efforts to understand, conserve, and restore imperiled wildlife and to develop adaptive management programs. He has also built an internationally recognized educational program at IUP that provides students with unique opportunities for experiential and service learning.

Dr. Larkin has a robust history of grant awards. His more than 60 external awards have secured more than \$6 million for research focused on the habitat and ecology of threatened wildlife species, specifically endangered populations of ecologically sensitive songbirds. He and his student coauthors have produced more than 50 publications and have provided important insights into the effects of humans and their infrastructure on the sustainability or restoration of these species. Dr. Larkin's work guides the efforts of state and national wildlife management agencies and helps with the recovery of

endangered wildlife species and their habitats. In addition to the direct impact his research has on the ecosystem, the funding it brings provides many opportunities and significant financial support for graduate and undergraduate students and helps to attract high-quality students from across the nation to IUP's Biology/Ecology, Conservation, and Environmental Biology program.

As a nationally recognized expert in ecology and in the conservation of neotropical songbirds, Dr. Larkin has—at the request of the US Fish and Wildlife Service, US Department of Agriculture, US Forest Service, US Department of the Interior, Pennsylvania Game Commission, and Pennsylvania Department of Conservation and Natural Resources—presented his research and participated in policy and management activities to promote the long-term viability of these species. In 2017, the USDA presented Dr. Larkin with the Abraham Lincoln Award in recognition of his role as science advisor for a federal conservation program. The Lincoln Award recognizes those who have made outstanding contributions in support of the USDA's mission and goals.

During his tenure as Distinguished University Professor, Dr. Larkin is completing data collection and analysis for post-fledgling survival, resource selection, and migratory connections to develop a full life-cycle approach to golden-winged warbler and cerulean warbler conservation. He is also working on two research articles summarizing wintering and breeding ecology and conservation efforts. Additionally, Dr. Larkin continues to protect imperiled species of songbirds through professional service to biologists from a variety of government agencies and conservation organizations that promote science-based decisions on adaptive management programs and conservation policies.

IUP faculty members honored with the Distinguished University Professor designation hold the title for life and receive a grant and a reduced teaching load for one year to assist with research and scholarship.

A MESSAGE FROM PRESIDENT DRISCOLL

About the President

President Michael Driscoll's leadership of IUP has been guided by principles that include empowering students to become the world's transformative leaders through high-quality academic programs, strong support structures, and interconnected, hands-on learning experiences outside the classroom.

Under his leadership, the university continues to develop new academic degree programs and revamp existing ones, leveraging IUP's strengths as a doctoral/research university to meet the needs of Pennsylvania's residents while attracting students from across the nation and around the world. IUP's international student population is the largest within Pennsylvania's State System of Higher Education.

Many students enroll at IUP for noteworthy programs such as safety sciences, music, and criminology. An American Psychological Association publication has cited IUP's doctoral program in clinical psychology as among the nation's top five, while the Modern Language Association has praised IUP's doctoral programs in English as among the most successful in advancing careers.

During President Driscoll's tenure, diversity and inclusion have been major focuses, as have military-affiliated students. Dr. Driscoll formed the President's Commission on Diversity and Inclusion to enhance IUP's learning atmosphere, and he created the Center for Multicultural Student Leadership and Engagement to reflect students' distinctive differences while acknowledging that they become better leaders through direct experience. IUP's Military and Veterans Resource Center assists veterans and active military personnel and their families in achieving their educational goals. Dr. Driscoll established the center, in part, because of research conducted by a team of faculty members and students who concluded that veterans successfully assimilate into civilian life and the college experience with unique support.



To the Degree Recipients,

When I was finishing my degree, commencement was nowhere near as important to me as it was to my family and friends. My parents made sure I walked across the stage so they could watch.

Looking back, I know that commencement marked an important transition in my life, just as it does for you today. This is the beginning,

the commencing, of the next phase of your life. We expect you to take what you have learned and use it to make this world a better place.

You'll be surprised at what you'll take along with you. Some things you think you'll always remember, you may soon forget. What will stay in your memory longest may be a particular faculty member. Years from now, you may still recall a lecture that person gave or a comment he or she wrote on one of your papers.

I can predict these memories with confidence, not just because I've been where you are today, but because I read alumni magazines. I see the letters and reminiscences that graduates contribute. Sometimes, they refer in detail to lectures that were given 50 or 60 years ago. Imagine!

Though you may have absorbed the contents of myriad textbooks or performed any number of laboratory experiments, it is the human interaction you'll likely carry with you—perhaps as long as you live. While faculty members have been teaching you their subjects, they've also been teaching you how to look at the world. Henry Adams wrote, "A teacher affects eternity; he can never tell where his influence stops."

THE UNIVERSITY



I ndiana University of Pennsylvania was established in 1875 and is the only doctoral/research university in Pennsylvania's State System of Higher Education. IUP has a long tradition of academic excellence and receives frequent accolades, including designation as one of *The Best 384 Colleges* in the 2019 edition of a Princeton Review book by that name. The university provides an intellectually challenging experience to nearly 12,000 students at three campuses, all easily accessible from Pittsburgh and the Middle Atlantic region.

GRADUATION BRASS ENSEMBLE

The Graduation Brass Ensemble includes members of the HoodleBug Brass and the Legacy Brass Quintet.

The **HoodleBug Brass** is the brass quintet in residence at IUP. It is composed of the four full-time brass faculty members within the Department of Music and the interim dean of the College of Fine Arts. The ensemble performs regularly on the IUP campus and presents numerous clinics and concerts in public schools and churches throughout the region each year. The HoodleBug Brass released its first compact disc, *Brass Fac's*, in March 2004 and its second, *Off the Trac's*, in 2009. *Christmas Postcards from the HoodleBug Brass*, the first commercial recording by the quintet, was released in October 2012 and is available on iTunes, CD Baby, and other online digital download sites. The quintet performs works of all styles, from the Baroque to contemporary, pop, and jazz.

"Hoodlebug" is a local term for "doodlebug," the name given to a single-car, self-propelled train or trolley. The Hoodlebug Trail can be found at the southern end of the IUP campus. A recreation and commuter trail, it stretches 10 miles across the central portion of Indiana County. The original hoodlebug traveled between Blairsville and Punxsutawney.

The **Legacy Brass Quintet** is the honors student brass quintet for the IUP Department of Music. The ensemble is open to any IUP music major in the brass area, and membership is determined by performance audition. Funding for this ensemble was made possible through a gift from Jim and Jamie Self. A 1965 IUP graduate, Jim Self has been a first-call tuba player in Los Angeles for more than 30 years. He is known for playing the "Voice of the Mother Ship" in the movie *Close Encounters of the Third Kind*. He has performed for hundreds of movie and television soundtracks in his career and as principal tuba in many of the top professional orchestras in and around Los Angeles. The Legacy Brass Quintet performs advanced quintet repertoire and receives specialized coaching from the IUP brass faculty.

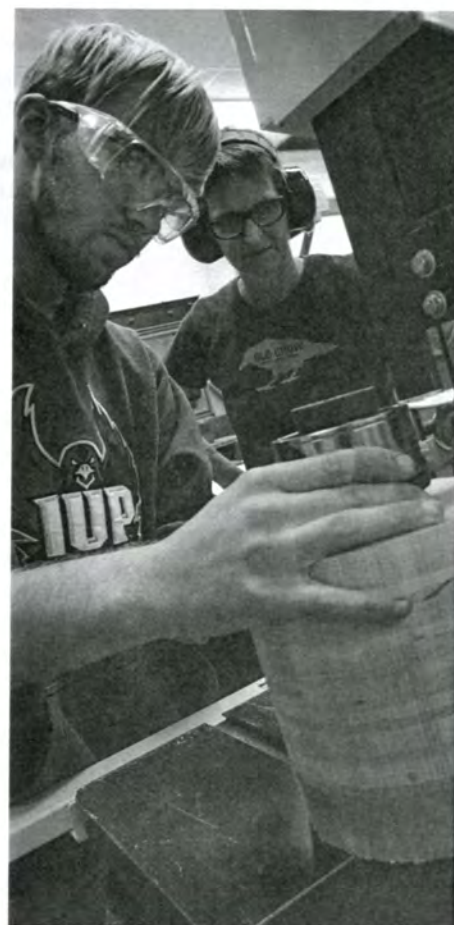

THE SYMBOLS OF LEARNING



Participants in the commencement procession are attired in regalia that reflects a history and heritage that can be traced to the medieval universities of the 11th and 12th centuries. Modern academic regalia evolved from the kinds of apparel worn by monks and students in the Middle Ages to keep warm in the medieval castles and halls in which they studied.

Academic life as we know it today began in the Middle Ages, first in the church, then in the guilds. The teaching guild was the Guild of the Master of Arts, and the Bachelor was the apprentice of the Master; their dress was the outward sign of stature and responsibility. Academic regalia was thus a visible manifestation—in color and pattern and design—that unified those of common discipline and like purpose.

In later centuries, to preserve the regalia's dignity and meaning, universities set rules of academic dress. American universities agreed on a definite system in 1895, establishing a code of approved attire. In 1932, the American Council on Education revised this code, which, for the most part, governs the style of academic dress today. The principal features of academic dress are three: the gown, the cap, and the hood.

The Gown. The flowing gown dates to the 12th century. Many think it was worn as protection against the cold of unheated buildings. It has become symbolic of the democracy of scholarship, for it completely covers any dress of rank or social standing. It is (with a few institutional exceptions) black for all degrees. Pointed sleeves indicate the bachelor's degree; long closed sleeves with a slit in the arm, the master's degree; and round open sleeves, the doctoral degree. The gowns for bachelor's and master's degrees have no trimmings; the gown for the doctoral degree is faced down the front with velvet and has three bars of velvet across the sleeves, in the color distinctive of the faculty or discipline in which the degree pertains.

The official colors of the college may also appear in the gown or its decorations. The trustees and some administrators of IUP wear gowns of slate trimmed in crimson velvet.

The Cap. The freed slave in ancient Rome won the privilege of wearing a cap, and so the academic cap is a sign of the freedom of scholarship and the responsibility and dignity with which scholarship endows the wearer. Old poetry records the cap of scholarship as square, symbolizing the book, although other authorities claim that it is a mortarboard, the symbol of the masons, a privileged guild. At the baccalaureate level, the color of the tassel on the cap denotes the discipline. The tassel is moved from the right side of the cap to the left side upon conferral of the degree.

The Hood. In regalia, the hood is an inverted shield with one or more chevrons of a secondary color on the ground of the primary color of the college. The color of the facing of the hood denotes the discipline represented by the degree; the color of the lining of the hood designates the university or college from which the degree was granted.



The Mace is a ceremonial staff carried by a senior faculty member who serves as grand marshal. This official opens formal academic ceremonies, such as commencement. Artist and metalsmith Walter J. Kipp '42 designed and constructed the mace for IUP in 1967. The design was created around the state seal, which is at the top of the mace. The large keystone which comes next symbolizes the state emblem, and on this keystone the letters IUP are placed. The handturned shaft is made of native Pennsylvania walnut.

The President's Medallion is worn by the president of the university during academic convocations as a symbol of the leadership responsibilities vested in that office. Michael A. Driscoll was the first president to wear the current medallion, which features the university seal in antiqued silver and crimson. A creation of the IUP Design Studio, this fourth presidential medallion was constructed by Medallion Art Company in 2014. Walter Kipp made the original medallion in 1968 for William W. Hassler, the 15th president. Robert W. Hamilton '54, M'64, a professor emeritus of art, created a replacement medallion in 1998, and Wendell August Forge crafted a third in 2005.

The Philanthropy Cord is worn as a symbol of philanthropic pride by the newest alumni who have contributed to the Senior Giving Campaign. This double-knotted gray and crimson cord symbolizes the reciprocal commitment between IUP and its alumni.

The Study Abroad Cord is a blue and green entwined cord that designates students who have participated in a one- or two-semester study abroad program during their studies at IUP. These students have studied in a wide variety of majors at universities throughout the world—and on every continent except Antarctica.

The Regional Campus Cord, in crimson and gold, is worn by new graduates who studied at an IUP regional campus. The crimson represents IUP as the degree-granting institution, and the gold symbolizes the knowledge and determination that were keys to success at the regional campus.

The Lavender Cord is worn by graduates who identify across the spectrum of gender identity, gender expression, and/or sexual orientation. The lavender represents a combination of the pink and black triangles gay men, lesbians, and some political prisoners were forced to wear in Nazi concentration camps.

The Red, White, and Blue Cord indicates a student's military affiliation. Those wearing the cord may be current or former members of the military or their family members.
