




WELCOME, GRADUATES, TO THE IUP ALUMNI ASSOCIATION



THE UNIVERSITY



Indiana University of Pennsylvania was established in 1875 and is the only doctoral/research university in Pennsylvania's State System of Higher Education. IUP has a long tradition of academic excellence and receives frequent accolades, including designation as one of *The Best 386 Colleges* in the 2021 edition of a Princeton Review book by that name. The university provides an intellectually challenging experience to more than 10,000 students at three campuses—all easily accessible from Pittsburgh and the Middle Atlantic region—among other sites.

Academic offerings include roughly 100 undergraduate programs and scores of graduate (master's and doctoral degree) programs. Unusual opportunities for research at all levels and the Cook Honors College provide special challenges for academic growth. The variety and quality of instruction are characteristic of a big university, yet at IUP, close, one-to-one relationships develop within the teaching framework, and a strong sense of community prevails.

A MESSAGE FROM PRESIDENT DRISCOLL

About the President

President Michael Driscoll's leadership of IUP has been guided by principles that include empowering students to become the world's transformative leaders through high-quality academic programs, strong support structures, and interconnected, hands-on learning experiences outside the classroom.

Under his leadership, the university continues to develop new academic degree programs and revamp existing ones, leveraging IUP's strengths to meet the needs of Pennsylvania's residents while attracting students from across the nation and around the world. IUP's international student population is the largest within Pennsylvania's State System of Higher Education.

Many students enroll at IUP for noteworthy programs such as safety sciences, music, and criminology. An American Psychological Association publication has cited IUP's doctoral program in clinical psychology as among the nation's top five, while the Modern Language Association has praised IUP's doctoral programs in English as among the most successful in advancing careers.

During his tenure, President Driscoll has focused on creating a student-centered educational environment. Since 2012, IUP has formed, among other initiatives, the President's Commission on Diversity and Inclusion, the Center for Multicultural Student Leadership and Engagement, the Military and Veterans Resource Center, and the University College, a resource for all students but particularly for those who are still exploring their options for a major course of study.



To the Degree Recipients,

Congratulations on completing your degree program. Commencement is a time to celebrate an end as well as a beginning. In your case, this is the beginning, the commencing, of the next phase of your life. We expect you to take what you have learned and use it to make this world a better place.

You'll be surprised at what you'll take along with you. Some things you

think you'll always remember, you may soon forget. What will stay in your memory longest may be a particular professor. Years from now, you may still recall a lecture that person gave or a comment that person wrote on one of your papers.

I can predict these memories with confidence, not just because I was once a new college graduate, but because I read alumni magazines. I see the letters and reminiscences that graduates contribute. Sometimes, they refer in detail to lectures that were given 50 or 60 years ago. Imagine!

Though you may have absorbed the contents of myriad textbooks or performed any number of laboratory experiments, it is the human interaction you'll likely carry with you—perhaps as long as you live. While faculty members have been teaching you their subjects, they've also been teaching you how to look at the world. Henry Adams wrote, "A teacher affects eternity; he can never tell where his influence stops."

PENNSYLVANIA'S STATE SYSTEM OF HIGHER EDUCATION

Pennsylvania's State System of Higher Education was established July 1, 1983, but its 14 member institutions, which include IUP, have a much longer history. Combined, the schools have more than 93,000 degree-seeking students and nearly 800,000 living alumni, most of whom still live in Pennsylvania. Currently, the State System is undergoing a redesign to ensure that its schools will continue to serve students, their regions, and the commonwealth far into the future.

DISTINGUISHED FACULTY AWARD FOR TEACHING

Prashanth Bharadwaj, professor, Management; dean's associate, Eberly College of Business and Information Technology

Prashanth Bharadwaj has been with the university for 27 years. A former Management Department chair, he has served as dean's associate for the last 13 years, responsible for strategic planning, international partnerships, and more. He also coordinates the maintenance of Eberly College's AACSB accreditation. A recipient of the Award for Excellence in Education from the Global Organization of People of Indian Origin, Bharadwaj is the architect and director of IUP's MBA program in India, which has nearly 1,250 alumni, and he conducts the Discover India study tour, which has had more than 250 student participants. He also coordinates IUP's Executive MBA and PhD in Business programs in partnership with Arab American University and has developed and managed many other international programs and partnerships in Asia, Europe, the Middle East, and Latin America. The director of Eberly's School of International Management, he has mentored hundreds of students from western Pennsylvania and all over the world. Bharadwaj was one of 12 US academics selected for a prestigious Japan study tour, and he is at work on a Collaborative Online International Learning project with colleagues in Norway.



DISTINGUISHED FACULTY AWARD FOR RESEARCH

Gloria Park, professor, English

Gloria Park has been a member of the English Department faculty since 2008. She specializes in teacher education for teaching English to speakers of other languages and serves as director of Graduate Studies in Composition and Applied Linguistics. Her research has been published in internationally recognized journals, and she has coedited special-themed issues of TESOL Quarterly and TESOL Journal. Her monograph, Narratives of East Asian Women Teachers of English: Where Privilege Meets Marginalization, was published in 2017 by Multilingual Matters. Park has served as a section editor for TESOL Journal and as a series associate editor, working with more than 30 authors, for the Teacher Education and Professional Development volume of the TESOL-Wiley Encyclopedia of English Language Teaching. She was also an invited national screener, reviewing more than 500 applications, for Fulbright English teaching associates who applied to South Korea and Malaysia. She will continue to serve as a national screener for Fulbright applicants to South Korea and other Asian countries. Park was recently nominated for the American Association of Applied Linguistics' Research Award Committee, which screens for the best research publication of the year.



DISTINGUISHED FACULTY AWARD FOR SERVICE

David Chambers, associate professor, Political Science

An IUP faculty member for more than three decades, David Chambers is recognized both for his years of service and for his variety of service roles. He has chaired his department in stints totaling more than 15 years and has coordinated its Master of Arts in Public Affairs program for more than 10. He has also chaired IUP's Free Speech Project since its 2017 inception, spearheading efforts to raise awareness about protections under the First Amendment. Central to his service have been his contributions at all levels to the Association of Pennsylvania State College and University Faculties, the organization that represents faculty members and coaches. That service has included many years on

the local Representative and Executive councils, as an elected IUP delegate to APSCUF's Legislative Assembly, as a member of the Meet and Discuss Team, which discusses policy proposals and challenges the university and State System face, and as a key figure during contract negotiations. A former chair of the University-Wide Promotion Committee, he helped streamline the promotion process at IUP. He also has chaired the IUP-APSCUF Grievance Committee for several years.

DISTINGUISHED FACULTY AWARD FOR CREATIVE ARTS

Jason Worzbyt, professor, Music

A professor of bassoon and the associate director of bands at IUP, Jason Worzbyt, a 1993 graduate of the university, has performed, recorded, and been featured as a soloist with wind ensembles and orchestras across the country. In 2001, he gave the world premiere of Bruce Yurko's Concerto for Bassoon and Wind Ensemble with the Keystone Wind Ensemble at the College Band Directors National Association conference. He has also given several recitals at meetings of the International Double Reed Society. In 2013, Klavier Records released a compact-disc recording, *Five in the Sun*, by the Keystone Chamber Players, of which Worzbyt is a member. During his 23 years at IUP, he has performed with many regional orchestras in western Pennsylvania and is currently the Altoona Symphony principal bassoonist. As a guest conductor, he has worked with elementary, junior high, senior high, and professional ensembles in several states. Committed to music education in the commonwealth, he is the band content area representative for the Pennsylvania Music Education Association and a former District 3 president and higher education representative. He has also created music study guides for a GIA Publications series.



DISTINGUISHED STAFF AWARD FOR SERVICE

Beverly Mastalski, administrative assistant, Office of the Dean, College of Health and Human Services

Beverly Mastalski has been a member of the IUP community since her freshman year in 1980. After graduating with a bachelor's degree in biology, she accepted a secretarial position and has remained on the staff ever since. In her current role in the College of Health and Human Services, she is involved with students from recruitment to graduation. She works closely with those who struggle academically, coordinating their academic recovery and providing other support as needed. Instrumental in revising the college's internship process, she maintains affiliation agreements with more than 1,000 clinical, field experience, internship, and externship sites. She is also editor of her college's monthly alumni newsletter, which she helped launch in 2019. Her service has included membership on her college's Research and Scholarship and Advising and Retention committees, the State Authorizations Internship Committee, the Strategic Enrollment Plan Committee, and the President's Commission on the Status of Women. In the fall, she joined the newly created Guides program, offering personal support to more than 25 new students, with the expectation of continuing that assistance throughout their time at IUP.

THE SYMBOLS OF LEARNING



Participants in the commencement procession are attired in regalia that reflects a history and heritage that can be traced to the medieval universities of the 11th and 12th centuries. Modern academic regalia evolved from the kinds of apparel worn by monks and students in the Middle Ages to keep warm in the medieval castles and halls in which they studied.

Academic life as we know it today began in the Middle Ages, first in the church, then in the guilds. The teaching guild was the Guild of the Master of Arts, and the Bachelor was the apprentice of the Master; their dress was the outward sign of stature and responsibility. Academic regalia was thus a visible manifestation—in color and pattern and design—that unified those of common discipline and like purpose.

In later centuries, to preserve the regalia's dignity and meaning, universities set rules of academic dress. American universities agreed on a definite system in 1895, establishing a code of approved attire. In 1932, the American Council on Education revised this code, which, for the most part, governs the style of academic dress today. The principal features of academic dress are three: the gown, the cap, and the hood.

The Gown. The flowing gown dates to the 12th century. Many think it was worn as protection against the cold of unheated buildings. It has become symbolic of the democracy of scholarship, for it completely covers any dress of rank or social standing. It is (with a few institutional exceptions) black for all degrees. Pointed sleeves indicate the bachelor's degree; long closed sleeves with a slit in the arm, the master's degree; and round open sleeves, the doctoral degree. The gowns for bachelor's and master's degrees have no trimmings; the gown for the doctoral degree is faced down the front with velvet and has three bars of velvet across the sleeves, in the color distinctive of the faculty or discipline in which the degree pertains.

The official colors of the college may also appear in the gown or its decorations. The trustees and some administrators of IUP wear gowns of slate trimmed in crimson velvet. **The Cap.** The freed slave in ancient Rome won the privilege of wearing a cap, and so the academic cap is a sign of the freedom of scholarship and the responsibility and dignity with which scholarship endows the wearer. Old poetry records the cap of scholarship as square, symbolizing the book, although other authorities claim that it is a mortarboard, the symbol of the masons, a privileged guild. At the baccalaureate level, the color of the tassel on the cap denotes the discipline. The tassel is moved from the right side of the cap to the left side upon conferral of the degree.

The Hood. In regalia, the hood is an inverted shield with one or more chevrons of a secondary color on the ground of the primary color of the college. The color of the facing of the hood denotes the discipline represented by the degree; the color of the lining of the hood designates the university or college from which the degree was granted.

The Mace is a ceremonial staff carried by a senior faculty member who serves as the grand marshal. This official opens and closes all academic convocations. Artist and metalsmith Walter J. Kipp, a 1942 graduate of Indiana State Teachers College, designed and constructed the mace for IUP in 1967. The design was created around the state seal, which was placed at the top of the mace. The large keystone which comes next symbolizes the state emblem, and on this keystone the letters IUP are placed. The handturned shaft is made of native Pennsylvania walnut.

The President's Medallion is worn by the president of the university during academic convocations as a symbol of the leadership responsibilities vested in that office. Michael A. Driscoll was the first president to wear the current medallion, which features the university seal in antiqued silver and crimson. A creation of the IUP Design Studio, this fourth presidential medallion was constructed by Medallic Art Company in 2014. Walter Kipp made the original medallion in 1968 for the 15th president, William W. Hassler, Robert W. Hamilton '54, M'64, professor emeritus of art, created a replacement medallion in 1998, and Wendell August Forge crafted a third in 2005.

The Philanthropy Cord is worn as a symbol of philanthropic pride by the newest alumni who have contributed to the Senior Giving Campaign. This doubleknotted gray and crimson cord symbolizes the reciprocal commitment between IUP and its alumni.

The Education Abroad Cord, blue and green entwined, designates students who have participated in an education abroad program during their time at IUP. These students have studied, volunteered, conducted research, and/or interned in a wide variety of majors at institutions and other locations throughout the world.

The Regional Campus Cord, in crimson and gold, is worn by new graduates who studied at an IUP regional campus. The crimson represents IUP as the degreegranting institution, and the gold symbolizes the knowledge and determination that were keys to success at the regional campus.

The Lavender Cord is worn by graduates who identify across the spectrum of gender identity, gender expression, and/or sexual orientation. The lavender represents a combination of the pink and black triangles gay men, lesbians, and some political prisoners were forced to wear in Nazi concentration camps.

The Red, White, and Blue Cord indicates a student's military affiliation. Those wearing the cord may be current or former members of the military or their family members.
